THE RETURN OF THE HEROES

European Ryder Cup stars Tommy Fleetwood and Tyrrell Hatton, above, plus Robert MacIntyre and Matt Fitzpatrick, all see this week's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship as the perfect pick-me-up after the victory against the United States

yrrell Hatton, the man who claimed the halfpoint at Bethpage Black that clinched only the fifth outright win for Europe on American soil, is defending his Dunhill Links title - and also aiming for a fourth success in a tournament he loves. "It would also be brilliant if I could win the Team Championship this week with my dad," said Hatton, who is partnered by father Jeff.

Fleetwood, meanwhile, an everpresent at the Championship since first appearing in 2011 as a member of the Challenge Tour, said: "I still dream of winning a tournament at the Old Course and being on the 18th green at that moment.

"It hasn't happened yet in my career, but this tournament offers me the chance to play three of my favourite courses in the world and I always love coming here walking on the beach at St Andrews, enjoying the town. Whether it's a Ryder Cup year or not, it's such an enjoyable week."

MacIntyre would love nothing more than winning this week in front of his adoring Scottish golf fans, while Fitzpatrick is partnering his father Russell for the first time. Two years ago, the former US Open champion won both the individual Dunhill Links title and the Team Championship with mum Sue.

After flying home following the joyous celebrations in New York State, all four Ryder Cup stars admit to feeling the physical and mental effects of Europe's herculean 15-13 triumph.

But Hatton said: "Last week took a lot out of us but I was quite well behaved afterwards. I didn't want to travel back feeling horrendous going into this week and I think the atmosphere here will be worlds apart from last week, which was pretty intense. I'm looking forward to it being somewhat quieter!"

Fleetwood added: "I feel there are a lot of things that happen this week – like catching up with a lot of great friends - that can reset you mentally and give you energy. I'm looking for a great week and hopefully a good chance to win."



HATTON HAS THE RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

yrrell Hatton has dominated the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship for a decade, winning in 2016, 2017 and again last year. He was also runner-up in 2018 and 2021. So, what is the defending champion's secret of success in this tournament?

"I think it's the custard doughnuts they serve at the halfway house," joked Hatton, an unbeaten star of the last two Ryder Cups. "They're dangerous and they must be what gets me through!

"Seriously, you obviously go into every tournament trying to do your best, but I think the slightly more relaxed nature of this week plays a part in why I've done so well in this event.

"As everyone knows, I can sometimes lose my head a bit on the golf course, but I enjoy the relaxed atmosphere of this tournament."

Another feature of Hatton's Dunhill Links success, significant perhaps to this week, is that his two runners-up finishes both came

immediately after a Ryder Cup – first Europe's win in Paris and then the defeat at Whistling Straits.

"After playing a Ryder Cup the week before under such an intense microscope, your game gets lifted in that environment," added the 33-year-old Englishman. "I feel I played some really good golf at times last week.


"So, I will be taking that into this week and hopefully I can give myself another opportunity to win this tournament."

Robert MacIntyre, meanwhile, will not lack motivation this week as he seeks a first Alfred Dunhill Links Championship title in front of the Scottish galleries.

MacIntyre, right, a proud Scot, is on record as saying he will support any tournament being staged in his native country.

"If we are playing in Scotland, anywhere in Scotland, I will always be there," said MacIntyre. And, asked to describe this tournament in a few words, he added: "Only two words: top drawer."





FITZPATRICK'S ON A NEW YORK HIGH

The 2023 winner is feeling confident after playing a pivotal role in Europe's inspired performance in the Ryder Cup

att Fitzpatrick comes into this week's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship full of confidence after playing a starring role in Europe's Ryder Cup victory at Bethpage Black.

Fitzpatrick, the 2023 champion, said beating the Americans last week was "easily one of the best experiences of my life" and added: "It's right up there with winning the US Open in 2022."

As one of European captain Luke Donald's picks, Fitzpatrick won two and a half points from a possible four to lay to rest criticism of his prior record of just one victory and seven losses in three previous Ryder Cups.

"Leading up to it I had been playing well so that just gave me the confidence to go out and continue to do just that – to have the results I did was a huge bonus," said Fitzpatrick.

"It was a big week for me, and I feel like I proved a point. It was something I had wanted to do for a long time."

Fitzpatrick is also enjoying a family reunion this week following his parents' decision not to travel to support him in New York.

This year's field includes 16 Ryder Cup players past and present, with a strong American quintet in Dustin Johnson, Brooks Koepka, Patrick Reed, Bubba Watson and Tony Finau.



MUM'S WON NOW IT'S DAD'S TURN

att Fitzpatrick and mum Sue made history two years ago as the first mother and son pair to win the Team Championship.

This year the Fitzpatrick family are back looking for more success, but with a significant difference. This time it will be dad Russell who will be teaming up with Ryder Cup hero Matt.

Sue said: "I've done the Dunhill for the last three years and really enjoyed it. I've played three, won one, so he's got a big wall to climb."

But Sue will still be at St Andrews, playing an important part in the action, this time partnering her younger son Alex, who plays on the DP World Tour.

With Matt living in the United States now and Alex travelling the world, Sue says the family have few opportunities to get together, but are making up for that with a big party in St Andrews after Matt's return from the Ryder Cup in New York.

Sue said: "We were all together briefly at Wentworth for the PGA but because of logistics the timings didn't work, but this week – as we've done in previous years we're all staying together. That's a bit of a bonus.

"We're really excited to be playing together. Russell is working hard on his game. No pressure from me, but I do keep saying 'played three, won one'.

"I've dined out on being a champion for ages. When I was playing that year, I had a brace on my knee, but I've had a partial knee replacement now and I'm 100%. We can't wait."

In-depth features include: what makes each hole interesting; what are its special characteristics; and what are the difficulties. The golfers reveal their tactics of how to play the hole they are describing and memories of how they played it in the past.

Alfred Dunhill's connection with St Andrews began in 1985 with the creation of the Dunhill Cup, the much-loved international three-man team event. In 2001 this became the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship in the form it is today, with a \$5 million individual professional competition and a Team Championship in which enthusiastic amateur golfers play with the professionals.

Champions include Tyrrell Hatton, who became the only player to triumph three times when he won in 2024, and two-time winner Padraig Harrington.



FAMILY TIES ARE MAGICAL FOR TWO US MAJOR WINNERS

ouble major champions Bubba Watson and Dustin Johnson are relishing the opportunity of combining their love of golfing history with making special family memories this week.

Watson, who won the Masters in 2012 and 2014, is making his debut in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and is playing alongside wife Angie.

Johnson, meanwhile, the 2016 US Open winner and Masters champion of 2020, has father-in-law Wayne Gretzky as his amateur partner.

Gretzky – who set more than 60 National Hockey League records – is also playing in the tournament for the first time and said: "Everything about this event is magical. I came here to play golf with a group of friends some years ago and you can just feel the history when you're in St Andrews.

"Bobby Jones played here, Jack Nicklaus won Open Championships here and so many other great players too. Now I get to play here with Dustin. I'm just thrilled that he asked me a couple of months ago to be his partner!"

Watson said: "I've heard so much about the event and I'm really

looking forward to playing. St Andrews is one of the most special and historic golfing locations in the world, and Carnoustie is among the greatest Open Championship courses.

"Kingsbarns is a beautiful layout and a challenge in the wind. I'm also excited to have my wife Angie with me and get to play with her."

Johnson and his wife Paulina have two sons and Gretzky added: "Dustin is the most wonderful son-in-law and father, and we always go to the Masters each year as a family to support him.

"I love watching him play. I'm not a very good golfer, but I just love the game and having fun. And Dustin knows the game inside out. He's much smarter than people think! He knows what he's doing."

Johnson said: "We've played together a few times at the AT&T tournament at Pebble Beach, but this is one of the best weeks. Wayne accomplished so much in his ice hockey career, and I've learned a lot from him.

"It's special being here. I still get nervous – good nerves – standing on the first tee at the Old Course. The fairway's nine miles wide but there's just something about that tee that gives you goosebumps!"







MAGNIFICENT MURRAY UP TO SCRATCH

wo-time Wimbledon champion Sir Andy Murray's golfing ambition is to try to qualify for the Open Championship – and the tennis icon showed in practice at Kingsbarns that his new sporting quest is no mere dream.

Sir Andy, left, who plays off a reported handicap of 1.9, shot a three-under par 69 on Tuesday as he prepared for his debut appearance in this week's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

The 38-year-old Scot has taken up golf seriously since retiring

from tennis last year. His handicap has come down quickly from seven, and he admits that golf is now a passion as he bids to become a scratch golfer.

He is, however, a realist and says his long career as a tennis professional has left him under no illusions about what he needs to do to make it – in the first instance – into regional Open qualifying events.

"I think a lot of amateurs don't understand the difference between a scratch golfer and a pro golfer," said Murray. "It is huge and I'm certainly not expecting that I would qualify for the Open. It's just that I think going through that process and trying to do it would be fun.

"I've been playing a lot and practising a lot, but I want to start playing in more competitions and handing in more cards. I love the competitive side of playing in competitions and that is why I want to do that more.

"I love the practicing element – I could spend three or four hours at a driving range and not get bored – there are so many different parts of the game to work on."


