THEY’VE ALL TURNED OUT FOR BOB

Scotland’s Bob MacIntyre soaked up the acclaim of home fans at Carnoustie after shooting a six-under-par round of 66. The Ryder Cup hero is three shots off the lead as he bids to become the first home champion since 2005

Scottish golf fans were out in force at Carnoustie to see local hero Bob MacIntyre launch his bid to become the first Scot to win the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship since Colin Montgomerie in 2005. They thronged the short walk from the putting green to the 1st hole and surrounded the tee as he hit his first shot. The fans also cheered the other three members of the European Ryder Cup team competing this week – three-time champion Tyrrell Hatton, Tommy Fleetwood and Matt Fitzpatrick – but it was

MacIntyre they had turned out to support, many shouting ‘Well done, Bob’ and ‘Come on, Bobby’. The Scot went round Carnoustie in a creditable six-under-par first-round score of 66 and goes into today’s second round at Kingsbarns just three shots behind the three leaders – England’s Matthew Jordan, Holland’s Darius van Driel and American Ryan Brehm. MacIntyre said he was blown away by the reception he received on Carnoustie’s 1st tee. “I’ve never seen the 1st like that at the Dunhill Links before. It was absolutely brilliant to get that reception.

Obviously, there is a good feel this year after the Ryder Cup and so it was nice that I could put on a decent show. “66 is all right. The energy levels are quite low, but you’ve just got to try and manage it, have a few good things in a round, and enjoy yourself as much as you can. We’ll see what we can do.” Among those on a congested leaderboard is the ominous figure of Dustin Johnson, winner of the 2016 US Open and the 2020 Masters, back at the Dunhill Links for the first time since 2012. He is on eight-under-par after a 64.

THE SUN SHINES ON JOHNSON

Two-times major winner Dustin Johnson benefited from benign conditions at Carnoustie and sits one shot off the lead

Former US Open and Masters champion Dustin Johnson lit up the traditionally fiendish links of Carnoustie with a superb opening round of 64 – but then thanked the weather gods after his eight-under-par show of strength.

“We were in the first group off and going out early today was a real bonus,” said Johnson, who is one off the lead. “There was no wind, and we got through the first eight or nine holes in good weather. I’m very pleased to have got a good score in.

“I’ve obviously played an Open Championship at Carnoustie and also have the experience of playing in a couple of previous Dunhill Links events a few years ago now.

“I kept the ball out of the bunkers which is so important here. They are the most penal places you can go because it’s always a chip out if you go in them.

“I was pleased with the way I played. I missed a few shots, but I always missed them in the right spots and that was the benefit of having played here a few times in the past.

“I hit a lot of really good shots and holed a couple of good putts, so I’m pretty happy with that. It was a solid round of golf.”

Johnson, 41, who won five points out of five when the United

States beat the Europeans 19-9 at Whistling Straits in 2021, has not given up hope of representing his country again in the Ryder Cup.

“Yes, I’d love to play in it again, but I do need to start playing a little better. But I’m getting more confidence in my game with rounds like this and beginning to swing it better,” he added.

Johnson’s fellow former American Ryder Cup stars Brooks Koepka, Bubba Watson and Patrick Reed also had solid starts to their tournaments at Carnoustie.

Five-times Major champion Koepka shot a five-under-par 67, and former Masters champions Watson and Reed had opening rounds of 68 and 69 respectively.

Europe’s four Ryder Cup heroes from last Sunday all enjoyed excellent starts at Carnoustie too. Tyrrell Hatton matched Bob MacIntyre’s six-under-par 66 while both Tommy Fleetwood and Matt Fitzpatrick shot 67s.

Fleetwood said: “I think five-under-par is a good score in the conditions we had. I grew up playing links golf, but it always amazes me how the wind can hit you on these courses, how short the ball can sometimes come up and how you need to make your adjustments.

“But I picked it up quite quickly and I got on a nice run in the middle of the round.”



SMITH EYES BIG WEEKEND

Cameron Smith is targeting an improved performance at Kingsbarns today as he aims to set up a weekend full of reminiscence and wonderful memories of the greatest moment of his career.

The 32-year-old Australian won the 2022 Open Championship at St Andrews, and this is his first appearance back here since that triumph – when he won by a stroke

over runner-up Cameron Young and by two shots over third-round leader Rory McIlroy.

Smith carded a brilliant final round of 64 to clinch his first Major title and now, after an opening par 72 at Carnoustie, he is highly motivated to climb the Championship leaderboard today and tomorrow.

“I’ve already spent a lot of time reminiscing this week, especially after flying in and playing a practice round at the Old Course on Tuesday,” said Smith, also a three-times Australian PGA champion.

“There are a lot of very good memories there. It’s a course I love playing and on which I feel really comfortable.

“With potentially two rounds at the Old Course to finish the tournament – if I can make the cut – it would be great to have the whole weekend playing there.

“I also have a great amateur partner in David Fox, who would also love to do well this week, so hopefully I can turn up at Kingsbarns and play a good round to set me up for St Andrews on Saturday.

“I’m staying at the Old Course Hotel again this time, which is really nice, and there are some great coffee shops in St Andrews too! I love the town, with all the golfing history that is around you. It’s such a different kind of place and it’s really cool to be back here.”



INSPIRED JORDAN SHOOTS 63

Spectators at the Old Course were treated to a thrilling finale as Matthew Jordan came tantalisingly close to breaking the course record in his first round. A thundering start on the front nine saw the Englishman go seven-under through 10 holes, but a frustrating bogey on the 17th eventually broke his rhythm. In the end, his nine-under-par round of 63 was enough for a share of the lead with Dutchman Darius van Driel and American Ryan Brehm.

The 29-year-old has an affinity for St Andrews. With two previous clear chances to break or equal the course record of 61 – set by Ross Fisher in 2017 and equalled by three-time winner Tyrrell Hatton last year – Jordan hopes that it will be third time lucky on Sunday.

“There’s just something about the front nine here,” he said. “I was seven under through the 8th in 2019, then seven under through the 10th last year. Starting so well this year was great but mostly I was pleased with my mindset.”

The Championship feels homely for Jordan, who is eagerly anticipating the next two rounds.

“The Dunhill is such a fun experience,” he added. “Each course has a different aspect to enjoy.”

Is Jordan an early favourite? His amateur playing partner Piers Morgan, pictured with Jordan, above, hopes so. “Matty is a fantastic links player,” said Morgan, who is tied 2nd in the Team event alongside Jordan on 14-under-par. “I’ve already booked my flight for Monday this time!”



WHO LET THE DOGS OUT?

LOUIS TIPS PROTÉGÉ FOR TOP

2010 Open champion says Potgieter can win Majors

Louis Oosthuizen knew that Aldrich Potgieter was special when he first welcomed the young star into his junior academy a few years ago. As they reunite in this year's Championship, Oosthuizen is convinced Potgieter will follow him as a Major winner.

"Aldrich has got everything in the game to compete in and win Majors. So, it's just a matter of finding the way that's best for him," said the 2010 Open champion.

"The first thing I noticed when he joined my academy is how level-headed he was. The length he hit it as a 16- or 17-year-old was just amazing. I could immediately see he had massive potential."

In 2022, Potgieter became the second youngest winner of the Amateur Championship aged 17. In 2024, he became the youngest winner in Korn Ferry Tour history aged 19 years, four months and 11 days with his triumph in the Bahamas Great Abaco Classic. This year he made further history when he became the youngest South African winner on the PGA Tour with victory in the Rocket Classic.

"Everyone always wants someone like that to immediately come through and be a superstar, but it will take time, especially in the Majors," said Oosthuizen, who finished with a brilliant seven-under-par 65 in his first round at Carnoustie

SCHOOL'S OUT FOR FITZPATRICK

For some people, encountering a former teacher years after you've left school is something to avoid. But when Matt Fitzpatrick teed off for a practice round at the Old Course this week, he was delighted to discover a familiar face from his school days in Sheffield was watching.

Fresh from Ryder Cup victory in New York, the English pro was walking down the first fairway with his parents Sue and Russell – both playing in the Team Championship this week – when he heard his name called from outside

the ropes. Now 31, Matt instantly recognised Andy Davis, a PE Teacher from his time at Tapton Secondary School, and greeted him with a hug, pictured right.

Davis was enjoying a day out watching pros and amateurs warm up for the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and looking forward to seeing Matt, his younger brother Alex, a fellow pro, and their parents playing later in the week.

"It was just by chance as we didn't know he was there," said Davis. "Despite following every round for the last ten years, we

haven't caught up with each other."

Fitzpatrick left the school, which also counts Olympic athlete Sebastian Coe amongst its alumni, after A-levels in 2013. He has gone on to win the US Open, play in four Ryder Cups and, in 2023, win the Championship in both the pro and Team events alongside his mother Sue.

"As a teacher, you never expect one of your pupils to become one of the world's best, even when you know they have incredible talent. So, watching the progress of both Matt and Alex has been remarkable," added Davis.

FISHER ON A HIGH AFTER 65

Ross Fisher opened his challenge with an excellent 65 at St Andrews – bringing back memories of 2017 when he broke the Old Course record with an 11-under-par 61.

He recalled: "My clearest memory of that day is missing a three-footer on the last hole for 60.

That was painful – but if you walk off St Andrews disappointed with a 61, then you're doing something right.

"I left a few out there today. I did think, 'hello, we could be on for another course record' – but I'll take seven under, and hopefully another crack at this place on Sunday."





CLINIC HITS PERFECT NOTE FOR KEATING

Boyzone star hails the work of the St Andrews Links Junior Golf Association in developing golf skills of local children

Tucked away beside the Old Course, the St Andrews Links Junior Golf Association (SALJGA) has taught the game to over 2000 local children since 2001. On Wednesday, a group of those youngsters – and their parents – were treated to a visit from the Boyzone star and keen amateur golfer Ronan Keating.

Keating is partnering English pro Daniel Brown in this year's Team Championship and stopped by the golf academy to offer the kids some pointers. For Keating, SALJGA represents a brilliant opportunity: one that he didn't have access to when he was growing up.

"I had no idea that kids here in St Andrews had this opportunity," Keating said. "Over 430 members, aged 7 to 12, get to come here every day and get coached? What an opportunity!

"I wasn't introduced to golf until I was 12 or 13. We didn't have access to clubs, or a driving range – or anyone with the skills to teach us how to play. What they're doing here is creating champions: there's no doubt about that, and I'm honoured to witness it."

Keating was joined by two Scottish golfing stars, Connor Syme and John Paterson, who are both vying to become the first home winner of the Championship since Colin Montgomerie claimed victory in 2005. Both have enjoyed successful seasons this year: Syme won this year's KLM Open, while Paterson equalled the Jubilee Course record on the final day of his St Andrews Classic triumph.

The Championship is a crucial date on Keating's calendar. 2025 marks his 13th Championship appearance. It's the social side that draws him back each year, though. "There's a whole bunch of us musicians here," he said. "I always really look forward to seeing them."

Next year, Keating will reunite his former Boyzone colleagues for two final concerts, at the Emirates Stadium in London. Keating quashed any notions of a permanent reunion but expressed excitement at closing that chapter – and finding more time for golf.

"A few of us play. Keith [Duffy] and Brian [McFadden] are mad for golf. Keith's playing nearly every day, so he'd probably beat me – but we'll see after the tournament!"

REDGRAVE IS GOING FOR GOLD AGAIN

The Olympic great has played every year since 2001 - and has an added incentive to make the cut for a fourth time

Sir Steve Redgrave has already made history at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – and the Olympic legend is targeting more personal glory this year.

“Each year, you get given a



Dunhill tie,” said Redgrave, who finished eight-under-par in the Team Championship after the first round. “It’s got white bands on the tail of the tie. But if you make the cut, then you get a gold one!”

Redgrave is one of only four amateurs to participate in every Championship since 2001. The 63-year-old has made the cut three times – in 2014 with Chris Wood, the year before with Jamie Donaldson and 2004 with Peter Senior.

A fourth golden tie at his 24th Championship is on his mind after a narrow miss last year.

“Daniel [Hillier, the New Zealand pro] and I were second after day one,” he recalled “We dropped to sixth after day two. We were a late tee-off at Kingsbarns [in the third round] and were still in the top 20 until the last putt on 18, when we dropped a shot.”



ADAM PRAISES HERO

Scottish amateur Cameron Adam is often compared to ‘lefty’ Ryder Cup hero Bob MacIntyre – and is now on the path to professional golf with the help of the Alfred Dunhill Links Foundation.

Based in Fife, 22-year-old Adam might not be at MacIntyre’s level yet, but 2025 has been a big year in his fledgling career and suggests he is destined for the pro ranks after travelling along Scottish Golf’s performance pathway from boys’ level to the men’s squad.

Adam won the prestigious St Andrews Links Trophy this year then played in the Open at Royal Portrush. It was his first Major appearance and he enjoyed practice rounds with fellow Scottish amateur Connor Graham and MacIntyre.

Adam said: “[MacIntyre] has been massive for me. Last year I was struggling with my putting, and he really helped me out. Being able to learn from someone like that who is having such great success is invaluable.”

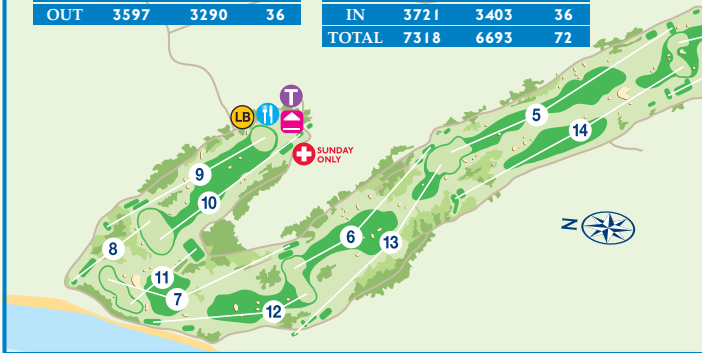

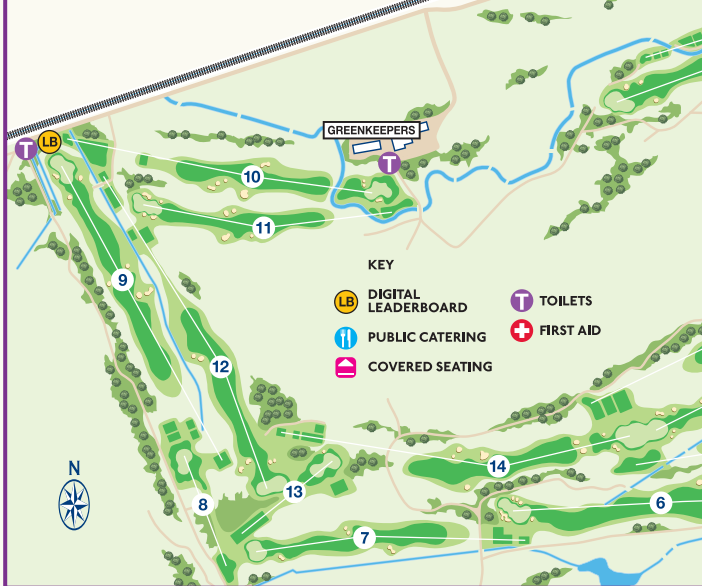

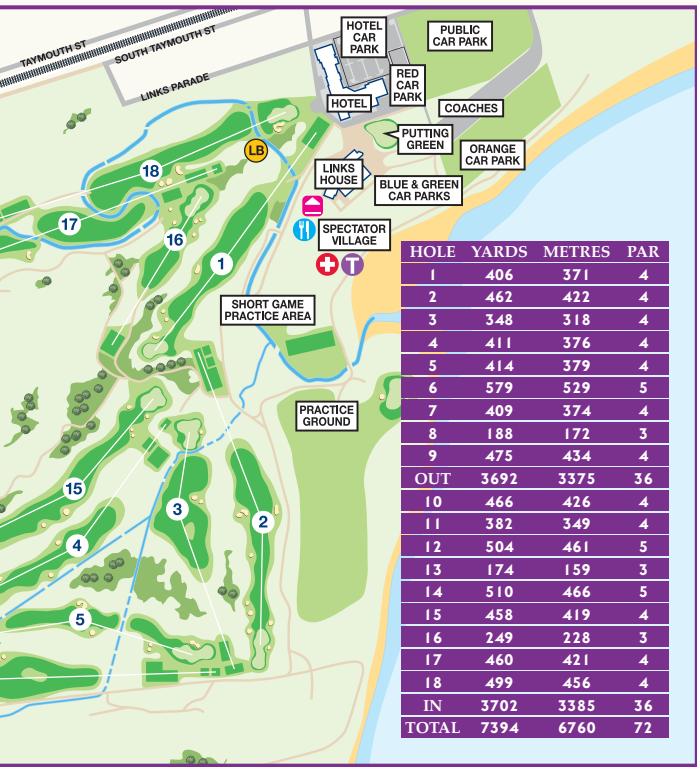
