BRILLIANT BOB’S ALMOST PERFECT ROUND

Scotland’s Bob MacIntyre mastered difficult conditions at Kingsbarns to post a brilliant round of 66 and take a share of the lead on 12-under-par. Playing in a fourball with tennis legend Andy Murray, the 29-year-old hit some incredible shots

Bob MacIntyre, the golfing pride of Scotland, shot one of the greatest rounds of his career to defy the worst of some ugly second round weather and surge to the top of the leaderboard.

MacIntyre carded a brilliant 66 at Kingsbarns to move alongside South Africa’s Richard Sterne on 12-under-par.

It was a second successive 66 for the man from Oban, following his six-under-par opener at Carnoustie in much more clement conditions, and MacIntyre called it “almost a perfect round of golf”.

He added: “It was just a lovely round, especially once the weather came in. It was difficult in the wind, but I controlled my flights really well and hit some beautiful shots.”

Louis Oosthuizen, who won the 2010 Open Championship at St Andrews, is just one stroke behind MacIntyre and Sterne on 11-under-par, with Scotland’s Scott Jamieson a further shot back. Oosthuizen’s second round 68 at Kingsbarns was another superb effort, though he had completed 12 holes before the worst of the weather made it more of a question of golfing survival.

Not for Bob. The 29-year-old left-hander and world No 9 carded seven birdies and just one bogey despite finishing just 45 minutes before play had to be suspended with a number of groups still to complete their second rounds.

MacIntyre has received a hero’s welcome from Scottish golf fans this week following Europe’s Ryder Cup victory.

MacIntyre added: “I’m where I want to be after two rounds and I’m playing nicely. But it was a big team effort out there with my caddy Mike, keeping everything dry and staying warm.”

STERNE IS EYEING UP A DUNHILL DOUBLE

After years of struggling with a debilitating hip injury that he has finally found a solution for, South Africa's Richard Sterne showed the kind of golf he's capable of as he now chases a rare place in Alfred Dunhill golf history.

With a second round of 67 on the Old Course to share the lead with Scotland's Robert MacIntyre on 12-under-par, the winner of the 2008 Alfred Dunhill Championship in South Africa now has the chance to claim a 'Dunhill Double' that to date only his countryman Branden Grace has achieved.

He's come close before, finishing second in the 2016 Championship, and he'll be using all of that experience to hopefully go one better this weekend.

"Fortunately, I've played here since 2001, so I know the courses. I always enjoy playing any of these golf courses. It's a privilege. I'm playing well and you can see that from the scoring," said Sterne.

He was fortunate to tee off early on Friday and avoid some challenging weather later in the day.

"I got the right draw so that helped," he added. "In all the years of playing here, sometimes you get good draws, and sometimes you get bad draws. Today I got a good draw and I'm pretty happy with that."

Sterne's last DP World Tour victory was in 2013. But the golfer who was once ranked as high as 29th in the world is taking full advantage of being injury free and chasing titles again.



KOEPKA TARGETS US WIN

Brooks Koepka is aiming to become the first US winner of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship this week. The five-times Major champion finished tied 2nd in 2015, two shots behind winner Thorbjørn Olesen. He is desperate to go one better this weekend.

"Ten years is a long time ago," said Koepka, who took time out yesterday to sign an autograph for a young fan. "I had dinner with Thorbjørn a couple of weeks ago and we were laughing about it."

"I'd love to do well here again. It depends how you play Carnoustie – and if you play Kingsbarns on a good day, then you can shoot a good number. Then on the Old Course you have the opportunity to shoot a good score."



JAMIESON CONQUERS CARNOUSTIE

Scott Jamieson's blistering start to his second round at Carnoustie has put him firmly in contention heading into the weekend. The Scot posted a superb 68 to finish on 10-under-par, just two shots off the lead.

"I'd seen the forecast and I knew that I was going to play the back nine – my front nine – downwind, before the rain came in and the wind was really due to pick up," said Jamieson. "I knew a fast start was required and then it would be a case of batten down the hatches and heading for home."

"I'm delighted. It's traditionally the tougher of the three venues, so I would have signed for anything in the 60s. The way the weather turned out, I was just delighted to hang on."

Jamieson made amends for a double bogey on the 11th with a bounceback birdie on the 12th. "In conditions like this, it is so easy for things to spiral out of control without doing a great deal wrong,"

he said. "It's so easy to get on a bogey train when it's like that. The birdie reset me and then I got a couple of good pars after that. You feel like you've got something to fight for on every hole when you keep making pars."

Jamieson is aiming to become the first Scottish winner of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship since Colin Montgomerie in 2005. He believes it is a tournament that brings out the best in him.

"It's always such a bunched leaderboard here and the weather also looks a little suspect [today]," he said. "It's going to be another day where I have to take it one shot at a time and hopefully put myself in a good position with one round to go."

"It's a privilege to come home and play these three courses. They're absolutely beautiful. The time of the year we come here can lead to questionable weather but it's great fun and I've made some really good friends with people at this event."

EARLY-BIRD MATT STAYS IN THE HUNT

The Englishman benefited from an early start to shoot 69, leaving him four off the lead and well placed to challenge

Former US Open champion Matt Fitzpatrick, right, dodged most of the second round's bad weather by being in one of the first groups out at Kingsbarns – but he still had to battle hard on his back nine to finish with an excellent 69 in the worsening conditions.

It put Fitzpatrick on eight-under-par for the tournament, after an opening 67 at Carnoustie, and the 2023 Alfred Dunhill Links Championship winner is again in a good position to challenge for the title this weekend.

With four birdies in his first seven holes, Fitzpatrick looked to be taking full advantage of the comparative calm of early morning

but by the time he turned for home the rain had started to fall.

Just one bogey on his back nine represented, in the end, a good result as the wind also got up. "I actually think Kingsbarns is the hardest of the three courses here when it blows because it's so open," said Fitzpatrick.

"You expect to have bad weather at some stage over the four days so I'm happy to get in with a reasonable score."

Ryder Cup star Fitzpatrick also had words of commiseration for father Russell, his amateur partner this week.

"Dad didn't play too well today but wearing glasses as he does wasn't ideal on the back nine!"



OOSTHUIZEN EYES UP ANOTHER OLD COURSE VICTORY

The 2010 Open champion is eager to make another magical memory on the 18th green at St Andrews on Sunday

South Africa's Louis Oosthuizen is back at St Andrews – where he won the 2010 Open Championship – looking for a 12th victory on the DP World Tour and what would be a 27th title globally.

Oosthuizen may turn 43 later this month but he is still more than capable of mixing it with the world's best, as he showed by following up a first-round 65 at Carnoustie with a four-under-par 68 at Kingsbarns.

It puts Oosthuizen in second place – just a shot behind joint leaders Robert MacIntyre and Richard Sterne – at the start of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship's third round.

And the prospect of playing both rounds three and four on the Old Course, the scene of his greatest triumph, will no doubt mean Oosthuizen fancies his chances of lifting another trophy on the iconic 18th green.

"I played really well although it was not much fun on the last six holes when the weather worsened," said Oosthuizen.

"We were lucky with having an early tee time and although I've been feeling a little sick in recent

days, I think it has helped that I've really not been worrying about golf. It's been more about just getting through the day.

"I love links golf. The first day here was one of the few times that I've played Carnoustie in weather that good and playing so well there gives you good motivation going into the next round.

"I also always seem to struggle at Kingsbarns but apart from one stupid bogey – when I three-putted from 20 feet – I played pretty good."

Other contenders near the top of the leaderboard include no fewer than nine players just one stroke back on 10-under-par. That group includes Scotland's Scott Jamieson and Northern Ireland's Tom McKibbin, while Italy's Guido Migliozzi is on nine-under-par.

The English Ryder Cup trio of Matt Fitzpatrick, Tommy Fleetwood and Tyrrell Hatton are in the chasing pack, with Fitzpatrick on eight-under and both Fleetwood and Hatton in a group on seven-under that also includes former Masters champion Bubba Watson.

Four teams top the Team leaderboard on 24-under-par, including actor Matthew Goode, playing with Spanish pro Alejandro Del Rey.

Actor Matthew Goode, right, spent months in Scotland filming the hit Edinburgh-based Netflix crime series *Department Q* – but his schedule was so tight that he had no time to hone his golf skills.

“I didn’t have my sticks with me once, so hopefully on the second season – which we’re starting next year – I’ll bring them up with me,” he said.

Goode is thrilled to be back at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship for the ninth time. “It means everything to be invited back, I love it,” said Goode, who is

tied for the lead in the Team Championship alongside Spanish pro Alejandro del Rey. “You get the chance to play three of the best Links golf courses in the world and I have made so many friends here.”

AP McCoy, left, who won everything as the greatest jump jockey of all time, is still a great competitor and says to win the Team Championship is still one of his goals.

“As an ex-sports person I would like to win the Dunhill Links pretty much more than anything.

“Sir Steve Redgrave says it’s the one thing that can make you competitive again.”

Sir Tony and his professional

partner Tom McKibbin are on 16-under-par in the Team Championship.

Meanwhile, Peter Jones, the *Dragon’s Den* star, is playing for the tenth time in the Team Championship, this year partnering Spanish pro Manuel Elvira. They are currently eight-under-par after the second round.

The entrepreneur and TV celebrity took time out to address a packed University of St Andrews lecture theatre where he spoke about his remarkable journey.

“It’s been wonderful to be here to spend some time with these students,” said Peter.



He plays to enthusiastic audiences wherever he goes and that was certainly the case for Hollywood legend Bill Murray when he teed off at Kingsbarns in the second round of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship. Golfers and fans especially love Bill for his

portrayal of whacky greenkeeper Carl in the film *Caddyshack*. He is a real entertainer on the course as well, and once went into an on-course food outlet at Carnoustie to personally cook a hot dog for the scorers for his group.
