UIHLEIN'S BACK WITH A MISSION

The American who missed out on victory here in dramatic circumstances a decade ago finds himself in a three-way tie for the lead of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, as last year's champion gets the better of Carnoustie's killer finish

en years ago, Peter Uihlein came within a whisker of winning the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, losing in a sudden death play-off to David Howell.

It was an eventful week for the American, who missed a putt for a historic 59 at Kingsbarns, and had a dramatic pitch in for an eagle on the 18th hole of the Old Course.

In the first round of this year's Championship it was as if nothing had changed as Uihlein, now 34, showed the same flashes of skill and determination as he powered to the top of the leaderboard with a 64 at St Andrews, and a first round tie with Spain's Adri Arnaus and Sweden's Sebastian Söderberg.

Uihlein said: "I was close here in the play-off. At the time, I didn't really know it, but looking back that would have been a really special one to win. I've always enjoyed coming back.

"I think it's a good test. I have good history here. I like it when it gets windy and challenging. It's just a lot of fun and something I enjoy doing."

One shot back is a group of six golfers: Scotland's Grant Forrest, American challenger Billy Horschel,

South Africa's Zander Lombard and Wilco Nienaber, Belgium's Nicolas Colsaerts and Sweden's Marcus Helligkilde.

Champion Ryan Fox mounted an impressive start to the defence of his title, with birdies on four of the last five holes of the difficult finish at Carnoustie.

He said: "I played great most of the day. Birdying a couple of those tough holes is a nice bonus. You don't expect to play those holes in a couple under."

Jens Dantorp and Ric Lewis lead the Team Championship after a 13-under-par at Kingsbarns.

BALE TARGETS SUNDAY SPOT

The football star watched the Championship on television as a Real Madrid player and now can finally take part

areth Bale may have retired from football earlier this year but his competitive instincts still burn brightly. Asked what his ambitions were for his first Alfred Dunhill Links Championship, the Welshman – at six-under-par in the Team Championship after a first round at St Andrews with French pro Romain Langasque said: "If I can make the cut, that's what I want to try to achieve. If I don't then I want to have a good time. Golf is such a difficult game that you have to try to enjoy yourself even if you are not playing well. But the goal is to make the cut.

"I'm really excited. This event has always been on my radar. I was never able to play in it during my football career because of the time of year. I used to watch it on TV, so to play it now in my first year since retiring is pretty special.

"At the Old Course, the history of golf is all here. I've played the Old Course and Kingsbarns but not Carnoustie. I've been told Carnoustie is its own beast so don't bother going there to practice, just keep the scar tissue out of your head!

"I did a trip to Scotland and Ireland in the summer, so I have a little bit of experience of Links golf. It's different from the sunny parkland golf that I play, so it'll be a good challenge.

"I've been striking it nicely and playing quite well. The one thing for us amateurs is that one day you feel like you can't miss a shot and then the next you feel like you can't hit a ball. That's why we love golf so much. It's the chase of trying to play well and do the best you can."

Bale's love affair with the sport started as a young player at Spurs and continued throughout his career in Spain at Real Madrid, where he made 176 appearances between 2013 and 2022. "I didn't start playing until I was around 20 at Tottenham," he said. "A few of the boys invited me along and you hit one good shot and you're hooked for life. That passion has just grown over the years and I'm lucky enough now to have the time to devote to playing some of these incredible courses, making amazing memories and meeting great people along the way."

Bale was also delighted to meet fellow Welsh star, Catherine Zeta-Jones, also making her Dunhill debut this week. "Whenever some-body achieves something very big in Wales, whether it be an actor, singer or sports star, they become the talking point of the whole country," said Bale. "She's been incredible for a long time in what she's achieved and it's been so good for Wales. It promotes us even more as a country."



The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship celebrates links golf at its finest and is played over the Old Course at St Andrews, the Championship Course at Carnoustie and Kingsbarns Golf Links. The final round, after the cut is made on Saturday, is played over the Old Course.

With a total prize fund of US\$5million, there are two separate competitions - an individual professional tournament and a Team Championship, in which each professional is paired with an amateur.

FATHER AND SON SPRINGBOKS TACKLE THE LINKS TOGETHER

'I've got big shoes to fill' says Schalk Burger Jnr. as he takes a short break from his Rugby World Cup television duties to play alongside his 'Dunhill legend' dad

hey both shone on the rugby field as father and son Springboks, and this week South Africa's Schalk Burger and his son Schalk Burger Jnr. will share the fairways as they play together in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship for the first time.

"It's very special. We all love what golf stands for and has meant in our lives, and to see your kids grow up in the game and to come to The Home of Golf and experience it together is just a privilege," said dad Schalk, who is a veteran of 18 Alfred Dunhill Links Championships, including a third-place finish in the 2007 Team Championship with his other son, Tiaan, as caddie.

But this marks the first time that Schalk Jnr., a Rugby World Cup winner with the Springboks as well as the IRB World Player of the Year in 2004 and now respected broadcaster, will play this tournament.

"It's a complete bucket list item



for me," he said. "When I received the invite there was no hesitation. Lucky for me the Springboks' Rugby World Cup schedule and my commentary duties also worked out as they have a break now [South Africa completed their group play with victory over Tonga on Sunday].

"But I've got quite big shoes to fill at this event because everyone I speak to says, 'Your dad is an absolute legend here'."

After their first round at St Andrews, Schalk Snr., playing with Hennie du Plessis, was one shot off the lead on 12-under-par, while his son, playing with Louis Albertse, was at seven-under-par.





ANDY JUST ACTS ON INSTINCT

hether he's on the fairways of the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship or the film sets of Hollywood, Andy Garcia has the same mental approach: 'Trust your instincts.'

The Hollywood legend – Oscarnominated in 1991 for his role as Vincent Mancini in Godfather III – said: "Both in acting and golf, a sense of relaxation is important.

"In golf, it's about trusting the instincts that will naturally happen in the swing. In acting, you try to be present in the moment, trust your instinct and the decisions your character makes moment to moment.

"You have to trust your visualisation, commit to it and accept the results. They are both about staying out of your own head – being relaxed and reactive is something that both acting and golf share."

Garcia is playing with Spanish pro partner Adri Arnaus in the Team Championship and finished his first round at Carnoustie on nine-under-par.

The actor has been a regular at the tournament over the years and is looking forward to the unique challenge of playing St Andrews, Kingsbarns and Carnoustie.

"It's a privilege to be invited and every year is amazing," he said. "You meet a lot of people over the years and become close friends – like Tico Torres and Huey Lewis. It's not the type of courses we're used to playing in the States. Most of the courses in America, if you have enough ability to attack the green, you're going to do it. Here, you can be rolling it up from 20 yards out."

HORSCHELS HARNESS THE POWER OF PINK

are supporting Breast Cancer Aware Month and their Pink Pony campaign by wearing pink during this year's Alfred Dunhill Links.

The Americans are the first husband and wife couple to play together in the Team Championship and they decided to do something to support this important initiative.

After scoring a 65 at Carnoustie in the first round, which put Billy one shot behind the leaders, he said: "We are supporting this cause, so every birdie we make is \$1,000, and we made quite a few of them.

"We will be in pink the next three days as well. It doesn't matter what the weather looks like, we are going to bring some brightness for the next few days.

"I putt very well normally but today was one of those special days where the hole looked like the size of the ocean. Every putt, if it didn't go in, was burning the edge."

Horschel says he enjoys coming to Europe to play. "I'm more relaxed, I think that's the first thing. It's just more simplistic over here. I think you guys all work hard, but it's not the be all and end all. That's why I've enjoyed coming over."

Billy and Brittany are nine-underpar in the Team Championship, four behind leaders Jens Dantorp and Ric Lewis.





NEW ROLE FOR ANT MAN STAR

ollywood star Kathryn Newton said she could only watch in wonder as fellow American Billy Horschel – a member of her first day four-ball at Carnoustie – shot a brilliant 65 to get onto the early leaderboard.

"I didn't play too well myself, but it was hard out there, and raining a lot of the time. But it was still very cool to see my professional partner, Connor Syme, play well with an opening 71 and Billy was on fire! He was rolling everything in and I was just hoping some of it would rub off on me!

"It was lovely also to meet Billy's


wife Brittany, who is partnering him in the team competition. It's an honour to be invited back to play in my second Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and I feel like I've played the Old Course more times, in practice and in the tournament, than I have any of my local courses in California!"

Kathryn is now an ambassador for the Royal & Ancient and added: "I am a big lover of the game and I just want to help to grow the game and to show people that anyone can go out there and play golf. It doesn't matter where you are from or what you look like – it's a game for everyone."

The Ant Man and the Wasp: Quantumania star is still buzzing from playing in the All-Star Match held before last week's Ryder Cup in Rome and said: "It was unbelievable to be involved in that.

"I'd always wanted to go to a Ryder Cup. Twice I've been invited but been unable to attend because of work commitments. And I played a lot better than I did today in the All-Star Match – perhaps, with a big crowd watching, there is a performance element for me!"

HALL OF FAME NFL CAREER KEPT JOHN OFF THE GREENS

John Elway won two Super Bowls as quarterback for Denver Broncos in the 1990s but his love of golf goes back 40 years

FL legend John Elway admits he has had to curb his offensive instincts to make the transition from American Football to golf.

The 63-year-old was one of the greatest quarterbacks of all time in a stellar career with the Denver Broncos, but where that position required him to dictate his team's offensive plays, Elway – playing in his first Alfred Dunhill Links Championship – admits that a different approach is required for golf.

"In American Football you can press and try to make things happen," he reflected. "In golf, when you press and try to make things happen, it goes south. There is some correlation between the sports in terms of the competitive nature. And obviously, as a quarterback, you have to think a lot more than other positions. That can help in golf, but it can also hurt if you start to think about too many things.

"In golf you have so much time between shots, whereas in football you have 40 seconds between each play and you are not thinking about anything other than what will happen next. You've got to be more patient in golf and learn how to keep your mind busy during the down times.

"Golf changes from day to day. It's trying to score when you have your C game, as well as when you have your A game."

Elway – who won three Super Bowls with Denver, two as a player and one as an executive – has had a four-decade love affair with golf and playing at St Andrews with pro partner Laird Shepherd, finished day one on two-under-par in the Team Championship.

"I started playing when I got out of college, so that's about 40 years," said Elway. "I never played during the season, so I was limited to playing three months a year for a long time. In the last couple of years, I've been able to play a lot more.

"I'm a 1.8 handicap. It keeps my competitive juices flowing and I don't get hit doing it, so it's easier on the body than playing in the NFL!

"I've played St Andrews before but never Carnoustie or Kingsbarns, so, I'm looking forward to them.

"The social side of it is so big. The people I've met are quality. It's fun to watch the pros play but also to catch up with people that you haven't seen for a long time."

MILAN GAVE ME MY LOVE OF GOLF

Ruud Gullit is playing in his 18th Championship, but his journey began in the 1990s with an extraordinary set of clubs

ilan, London... St Andrews. Ruud Gullit's love affair with golf has taken him across Europe, but he is never happier than at the Old Course.

It was in Italy in the nineties – while playing for an ultra-successful AC Milan team with fellow Dutchmen Marco van Basten and Frank Rijkaard – that he first picked up a set of clubs.

He recalled: "Milan gave me a bag of irons – Jack Nicklaus McGregors! They were the most difficult irons to play with that I ever had. I had Persimmon woods and a leather, cream-coloured bag.

"In Italy, living a hectic life, you needed something to do where you could be on your own, in nature, and for me that was golf.


Sometimes I'd play by myself nervous on the first tee."

and just think about life. When I moved to London to join Chelsea, there were plenty of golf courses. I had to get used to rules – no jeans or sneakers in the club house. But in England, you can play golf with anyone from a lawyer to a taxi driver. It was more accessible than in Italy and Holland, where it was very elite."

This year marks Gullit's 18th appearance at the Championship and after an opening round with fellow Dutchman Daan Huizing at Carnoustie, sits on six-under-par in the Team Championship.

"To get an invitation to this tournament is the biggest honour you can have," he said. "It is almost like a little family that you see once a year. I've played football in front of 80,000 people, but I still get nervous on the first tee."

COASTAL COALITION OUT TO SAVE LINKS

Climate-based challenges pose a threat to Links golf, but nature may also hold the key to its long-term survival

he threat posed to golf on the Fife coast by climate-induced challenges is being addressed by projects grounded in nature and backed by science – and led by the St Andrews Links Trust (SALT).

SALT is dedicated to ensuring golf can be played here for genera-



tions to come. Lead West Sands Ranger Ranald Strachan believes initiatives like saltmarsh regeneration around the golf courses are paramount to achieving that aim.

"We are doing vital work along the coastline, include planting intertidal mudflats and marshes along the Eden estuary," he said. "The Green Shores is an exciting project which is encouraging innovative marsh restoration."

Funded by the Scottish Nature Restoration Fund and led by Dr Clare Maynard of St Andrews University, the Green Shores project is maintained by plant hubs on the Eden Course which grow on saltmarsh plugs.

Alongside dune restoration, the Green Shores contributes to the rejuvenation of over 800m of coastal marsh by volunteers, greenkeepers and ranger service staff.




