## FIVE FIX THEIR SIGHTS ON LINKS GLORY

Ryder Cup star and 2022 US Open winner Matt Fitzpatrick leads the way into today's Alfred Dunhill Links Championship third round, as the likes of defending champion Ryan Fox, popular American Billy Horschel and Scotland's Grant Forrest are also in contention for this year's title.

After a rain affected Saturday, Forrest starts out on 12-under-par, alongside Spain's Nacho Elvira, just one shot behind Fitzpatrick, while Fox and Horschel begin the day a further three strokes back.

Sue Fitzpatrick, meanwhile, tees off today in second place in the

Team Championship alongside her elder son Matt, who is partnering his mum for the second successive year.

On Friday, at Kingsbarns, Sue got a ringside seat as Matt carded nine birdies in a wonderful 64 – with his final birdie dramatically taking him into the lead with the last shot of the second round.

Forrest, the 30-year-old from Livingston who plays at Carnoustie today, is bidding to become the first Scottish winner since 2005 and his 67 at the Old Course on Friday followed an impressive opening 65 at Kingsbarns.

New Zealander Fox, mounting a

fine title defence with rounds of 66 and 69 so far, plays the Old Course today, as does Horschel, the seven-times PGA Tour winner who is partnered in the Team Championship by his wife Brittany. Matthew Southgate starts out on ten-under-par alongside fellow Englishman Marcus Armitage.

Fitzpatrick said: "I just wanted to make the cut with mum and do well for the team and you never know what can happen!"

The 2023 Alfred Dunhill Links Championship will now conclude tomorrow with the final round at the Old Course, St Andrews. Course entry will be free.

# PARTNER POWERS FORREST FORWARD

*Scot in position to end  
18-year wait for home win*

**G**rant Forrest was inspired by his amateur partner Nicholas Jonsson as he ended his second round a single shot off the lead in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship.

Playing at the Old Course and starting at the tenth, Forrest's eagle on 14 was the highlight of a 67 that gives him a chance of becoming the first Scottish winner since Colin Montgomerie in 2005.

And Jonsson, chairman of Jonsson Workwear Holdings in South Africa, was also in similarly fine form, leaving the team in a share of fifth place, on 19-under-par.

"Our amateur partners were great," said Forrest, pictured below, whose only Tour win came a few miles up the road at Fairmont, in the 2021 Hero Open. "I think we just feed off each other."

Leading the Team Championship is Stephane Connery, who continued a family love affair with the Old Course, hitting the front with French professional Julien Guerrier on the ground he has said was 'like a cathedral' to his late father, the actor Sir Sean Connery.

A betterball 60 in the second round put that team on 23-under-par, one ahead of the Fitzpatrick family partnership of Matt and mum Sue, who had a betterball 14-under-par at Kingsbarns.

Also in the top 20 are defending champions Callum Shinkwin and Alex Aquavella, Matthew Southgate and Ian Botham and David Howell and Michael Vaughan.

# SWING SHIFT WORKS FOR ARMITAGE

**M**arcus Armitage shot a second-round 68 at the Old Course to finish 10-under par, three shots behind leader Matt Fitzpatrick. The 36-year-old has endured a tough year but admitted that the relaxed atmosphere of the tournament has rubbed off on him.

"I'm really enjoying the golf this week," said Armitage, pictured above right. "I've been getting a bit bogged down in results and feeling a bit emotional with it all, but this week has been relaxed. I'm happy with the way I played."

"It's been a tough year for me. I've missed seven cuts by one shot. I went back to my old swing coach after missing the cut at Wentworth. He's given me a bit of advice and got me to a good place. There's a reason I'm on the score I am – I'm playing some good golf."

Last year's winner, Ryan Fox, shot a 69 at Kingsbarns to finish on nine-under par, while American

Billy Horschel is on the same score after a second-round 68 at the same course. "I played a really good round," said Horschel.

"Unfortunately, we may have got the tougher end of the draw in the morning by playing in the wind. For the guys playing later in the day, the wind died down, but over all I'm very happy. We are going to have to go really low today."

Peter Uihlein, pictured below right, posted a 72 at Carnoustie, and lies a shot further back on eight-under par. Ten years ago, the 34-year-old missed a putt for a 59 at Kingsbarns and later lost to David Howell in a play-off.

"Ten years ago! It feels like a different life," said Uihlein, who plays Kingsbarns today. "I was young and naive at that point. It's something I'd love to have on my CV."

"I've always liked Kingsbarns. I remember playing with Ernie Els in 2010. He's one of the guys I've always looked up to. It's a fun course but it'll be hard."



## SUE CAN'T FORGET HER WALK UP 18

*The mother of pros Matt and Alex Fitzpatrick had 'one of the best weeks of my life' here last year and couldn't wait to return*

**S**ue Fitzpatrick says playing at St Andrews in last year's Championship in the company of her sons Matt and Alex was 'one of the best weeks of my life'.

Sue, a major influence on both boys' careers, was playing with Matt, the former US Open champion, while Alex was in the same Old Course fourball, and received a rapturous welcome as she approached the final green.

"To get the chance to play with both my sons in this tournament is brilliant," she said. "Last year I loved playing with Matt and Alex at the Old Course and especially the 18th hole. It was one of the best weeks of my life."

Mother and sons got to play

Carnoustie together this time around – Matt and Sue are together again this year and were joined for the opening round by Alex and his amateur partner, Gerry McManus.

However, this time Sue has a knee injury originally sustained after a slip while supporting Matt at the 2021 Ryder Cup.

"It's not ideal to have this bad knee but it's great to be able to play here again this year and I didn't want to miss the chance," she added.

"I've got a brace on my left knee and I really do need to get it sorted out – I probably need a new knee!" said Sue.

After their second round at Kingsbarns, Matt and Sue are on 22-under-par in the Team Championship, in second place.





# FLEETWOOD FINDS THE GOING TOUGH

*The Ryder Cup hero got a great reception at Kingsbarns, but mistakes on the par fives saw him slip down the field in a competition he has played more than any other*

Ryder Cup hero Tommy Fleetwood was disappointed with his game after a second round 73 at Kingsbarns but insisted his energy levels are still good after all the excitement of last week's European team triumph against the United States in Rome.

Fleetwood memorably drove the short par-four 16th at the Marco Simone Golf and Country Club in the Sunday singles – the shot that sealed Europe's regaining of the trophy. And he opened here with a promising 69 at Carnoustie, but admitted there were a few hiccups as he dropped down the field. At two-under-par he has much ground to make up if he is to challenge the leaders.

"I am very disappointed in the way I played and a lot of little things went wrong," said the Englishman. "I particularly didn't play the par fives very well, but it can't be helped and I must now look forward to playing well at St Andrews. If I can shoot a good third round score on the Old Course then that would give me a chance.

"It's great that there are a lot of people giving me a brilliant reception as I play this week, but I'm just focusing on trying to play my best here because this is a tournament I

really enjoy and really want to win.

"It was very windy when we went out and that takes it out of you a bit but, overall, I really do feel fine energy-wise and just need to play better in my next round."

Fleetwood has appeared in the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship more than any other event on the DP World Tour, finishing tied for second place in both 2014 and 2018. He added: "I love Links golf. I love this tournament in particular, and ever since I've been coming here, I've dreamt of having my picture taken on the Swilken Bridge with the trophy. This is our once-a-year opportunity to do it, and I'll be working hard to try to make that happen.

"No matter everything that happened in Rome last week, and the fact that my preparation might not have been the best, my desire to win this tournament and be up there in contention is very, very strong."

Fleetwood is also resplendent this week in his blue-and-yellow European team golf shoes from Rome and said: "They are the only ones I've got with me! I actually didn't really want to wear these shoes because I thought I might ruin them. It will be a bit of a disaster if these do get ruined, so I'll be doing my best to keep them dry."



## FROM POP TO ROCK, MEET THE SWINGING SUPERGROUP

*The Alfred Dunhill Links Championship has brought together a group of musicians who over the years have formed a special bond, despite coming from 'different worlds'*



Listen closely and you might just hear the notes of some famous songs drifting across the links. Over the years, a cohort of famous musicians – including Keane lead singer Tom Chaplin, ex-Boyzone star Ronan Keating, Mike and the Mechanics' Mike Rutherford and Linkin Park's Dave Farrell – have

grown ever closer and started to crank out famous numbers during their social meet-ups.

Add in Bon Jovi drummer Tico Torres plus American rocker Huey Lewis, and it is not just on the fairways that the Dunhill goes with a swing.

Chaplin, pictured left, said: "All the musicians have a real bond and

we now have a band meeting each year. We got together on Wednesday night to discuss what we're going to play.

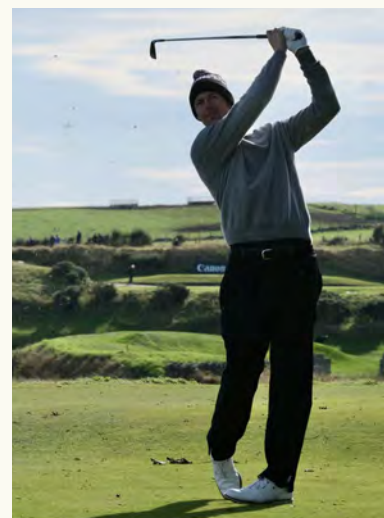
"It's a ragtag bunch because we are from different worlds, musically. We'd never be thrown together otherwise, which is a special thing about this event. We're looking forward to smashing out a few songs."





Linkin Park's Farrell, right, will be at the centre of the ensemble again, but he will also be keeping an eye out for ex-footballer Gareth Bale, making his Dunhill debut. Farrell is a fan of the LAFC soccer team and regards Bale as a hero for one famous goal in particular.

"I want to pick his brain to see how important the goal he scored in the MLS Cup final was to him," he said. "To LAFC fans, Bale was already on an insane level, but that goal just put him over the top. Their centre-back was 6ft 5ins and had already scored twice from set-pieces against us in the game. Bale jumped over him to win the ball and score. That was LAFC's first championship, a big, big deal."



## GOODE'S FIRST CUT STILL THE DEEPEST

Matthew Goode made an unforgettable debut at the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship 13 years ago – and has been trying to recapture the thrill of it ever since. In 2010, the Downton Abbey actor ended up in the final group and had a front-row seat as his pro partner Danny Willett went head-to-head with eventual winner Martin Kaymer.

"It's ridiculous that in my first year I ended up in the final group," he said. "It doesn't get better than that. If that's the only time I ever make the cut, then it's great to look back on. To see Martin and Danny duking it out was amazing – there were eagles and birdies galore."

"Danny eagled the 14th to level it and then Martin stuck a birdie putt in right on top of him. It was very, very close, but then Martin won out. You get quite close to a pro over the few days, and I still send Danny the occasional text. I really wish him well. He's been through some interesting times over the last few years."

Goode finished fifth in the Team Championship in 2010 but has failed to make the cut since. He is hopeful of changing that this year in the company of pro partner and 2014 Ryder Cup hero Jamie Donaldson. "He's a fantastic fellow, very funny," said Goode.

"All the pros are brilliant players but it's nice when you get someone with real personality. As amateurs, we're just trying to stay out of their way, not walk across their line or do anything stupid."

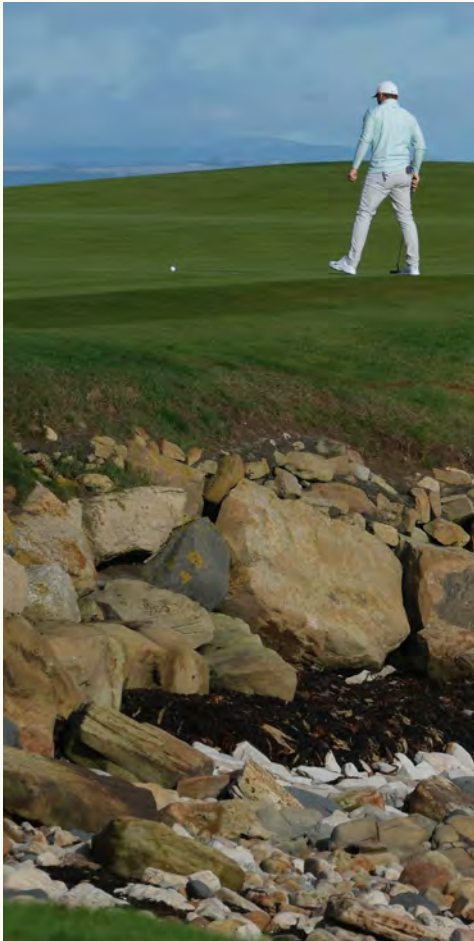

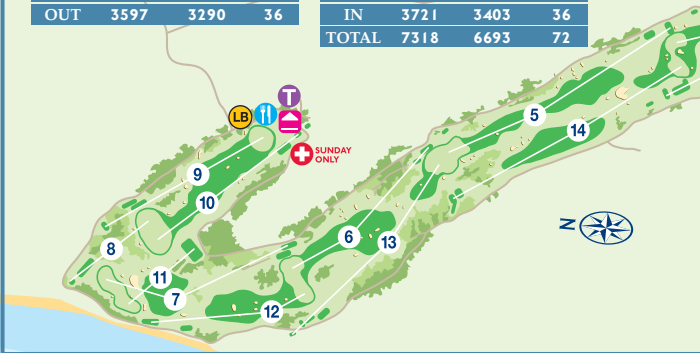

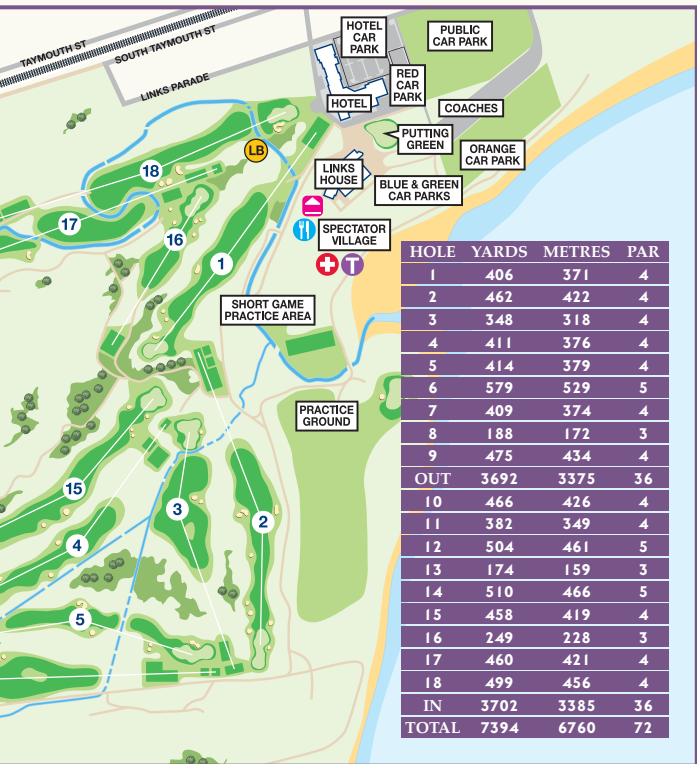
